Rescue program for little owl in Czech Republic

- Developed in 2020 by AOPK Czech nature protection agency
- Goal: To raise the dwindling population of little owl in Czechia from around 100 pair present today to over 1000 pairs and stabilise their numbers, possibly expand the species distribution to cover more area of CZ
- Core members: AOPK, ČSO (Czech Society for Ornithology), funded by EHP funds and MoE CZ


The biggest challenge - general public and blurring the line of who the stakeholders are


- The population is now present almost exclusively only in northwestern Bohemia and Southern Moravia
- Little owl prefers low density agricultural areas due to its nesting (old barns etc.) and hunting habits
- Unsuitable habitat and anthropological "traps" present the most common cause for mortality of little owl
- Actions of the nature protection stakeholders themselves (AOPK, ČSO etc.) may not be enough without involving private subjects

The biggest challenge - general public and blurring the line of who the stakeholders are, II

- Preventing the decline of little owl rests only partially on policy changes (agricultural changes can account for reducing the number of starved individuals, predation can be reduced by reducing number of cats)
- Reintroduction potential is limited and can potentially cause new problems for the species


























Results?

- Increased awareness of the needs of the species (specific bird housing to prevent predation, grass cutting, covering water traps, covering one way steep chimneys)
- Gradual involvement of private subjects (local carpentry school producing special bird houses for little owl, partnership with clothes manufacturer etc.)
- Presenting the activites and importance of little owl in public broadcasting services, Youtube etc.
- Over 4.600 social media users, average 100 reactions to posts about little owl

• Gradual transformation of general public and private subjects into stakeholders leading lowering of the mortality rate of the species and creating more suitable habitats to support increase of the population

Transferable good practices

- Communication with general public and education can lead not only to raising awareness, easing the realisation of projects by nature protection services and securing future funding, but to creation of new stakeholders committed to conservation
- Heavy investment into these activities (especially for species, which are strongly endangered by anthopogenic activites) can yield best results when it comes to longevity of the conservation projects
